Led by a seasoned female Executive Director with 23 years of experience, FYF boasts a team of 51 qualified program staff and finance experts, with a balanced gender ratio. Over the past 3 years, FYF has managed substantial grant portfolios totaling approximately USD 823,529 from thirteen donors. This funding has been crucial in driving FYF's impactful initiatives across Malawi. Strong partnerships with the Government of Malawi and other key stakeholders have further enhanced FYF's influence and reach within the country. Guided by a commitment to sound financial management and sustainable development practices, FYF continues to make a significant difference in the lives of those it serves.
